

**WHEREAS**, colorectal cancer is the second-leading cause of cancer deaths in the United States among men and women combined; and

**WHEREAS,** colorectal cancer is one of the few cancers that can be prevented with timely screening, but 1 in 3 eligible Americans are not up to date on screening and it is estimated to be the number one cancer killer for those ages 20-49 by 2030; and

**WHEREAS**, Black Americans are 20% more likely to be diagnosed with colorectal cancer and about 40% more likely to die from the disease than other groups; and

WHEREAS, colorectal cancer is expected to account for 11% of cancer deaths among Hispanic men and 9% of cancer deaths for Hispanic women; and

WHEREAS, in 2023 there were approximately 153,020 new cases and 52,550 deaths from colorectal cancer in the United States alone; and

WHEREAS, the national goal established by the National Colorectal Cancer Roundtable is to strive to increase timely screening rates to 80% in every community for all Americans eligible for screening; and

WHEREAS, increased education and community support services such as those provided by Palm Springs based organizations like Checky Charity and others are needed to enable the prevention and early detection of colorectal cancer to increase chances of survival; and

**WHEREAS**, observing a Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month during the month of March would provide a special opportunity to increase awareness and offer education on the importance of early detection and screening of colorectal cancer;

**NOW, THEREFORE,** we the City Council of Palm Desert, California, by the power vested in us, do hereby proclaim the month of March 2024 to be:
