#### General Background

- On September 12, 2024, the City Council held a study session to consider policies for updates to Title 26 (Subdivisions) and Title 27 (Grading)
- Grading policies included updates for grading transition and stockpiling
- City Council was supportive of recommended updates
- Future comprehensive amendments to the Grading and Subdivision Ordinances for Q1 2025
- Unified Development Code



### New Definitions

•New definitions in support new "Finished Grade Transition Standard":

"Abut"

- "Building pad"
- "Existing-, finished-, natural-grade"



### Finished Grade Transition Standard

- Intended to create sensitive transition of finished grades between new development and existing residential land uses
- Limit height of new grades above existing grade at property boundary
  - Within 100' of property boundary, new grades are limited to 5' above existing grade.
- Exceptions for:
  - Master Planned Communities planned for approval at same time, developed in phases
  - Environmental or Hazard Mitigation the additional height is necessary to prevent adverse effects
  - Site Topography consider existing topography conditions which render lower finished grades infeasible



## Stockpiling

- Amend section to add requirements for agreements and securities including stocks and bonds
- Ensure work is completed and provide for site restoration
- Remove references to mining
  - Prohibited land use per Zoning Ordinance



#### Recommendation

Introduce an Ordinance entitled, "AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM DESERT, CALIFORNIA, UPDATING SECTIONS OF TITLE 27 GRADING AND MAKING A FINDING OF EXEMPTION UNDER CEQA."
