

# Calls for Service




**Priority 1** - Involve circumstances that pose a clearly defined threat to human life or property.

Priority 3 - Involve circumstances which are neither urgent nor life threatening (e.g., disturbances of the peace)












**Part 2 Crimes:** (as defined by the Federal Bureau of Investigation) Forgery, fraud and insufficient funds checks, sex offences felonies, sex offences misdemeanors, non-aggravated assaults, weapons laws, offence against family, narcotics, liquor laws, drunk/alcohol/drugs, disorderly conduct, vagrancy, gambling, driving under the influence (alcohol and/or drugs), vehicle laws, vandalism, warrants, receiving stolen property, federal offences with or without money, miscellaneous felonies, and miscellaneous misdemeanors.

### Traffic Safety Definitions and Formulas:

<u>Traffic Enforcement Index</u> - A statistic that reflects the effectiveness of a traffic enforcement program in reducing accidents and is expressed as Hazardous Citations + DUI Arrests / Fatal & Injury Collisions.

<u>Traffic Collision Index -</u> A statistic that measures non-injury collisions over fatal and injury collisions, expressed as Non-Injury Collisions / Fatal & Injury Collisions.
