Executive Summary:

The majority of people visit the playground for children's play weekly or monthly with 2/3 visiting in the morning or evening and 1/3 in the afternoon. The age groups are mostly balanced from 0-3 years, 3-5 years, and 5-10 years with about half as many over 10 years old. More than half the people are satisfied with the current facilities and the other half are neutral or dissatisfied. Most people feel the playground is safe. About half the people feel there is enough shade for children, parents, and caregivers and about half the people feel there is adequate seating. About half the people feel the playground is accessible for children with disabilities. About 3/4 of the people would like to see more nature-based elements at the playground (rocks, native plantings, birds, butterflies). People were mixed on the preferred design style. The highest ranked amenities desired to be added or improved are restrooms, drinking fountains, lighting, and picnic tables. About 3/4 of the people would like to see community events hosted at the playground.

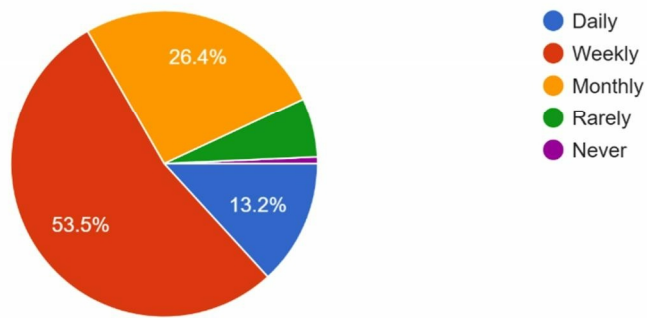

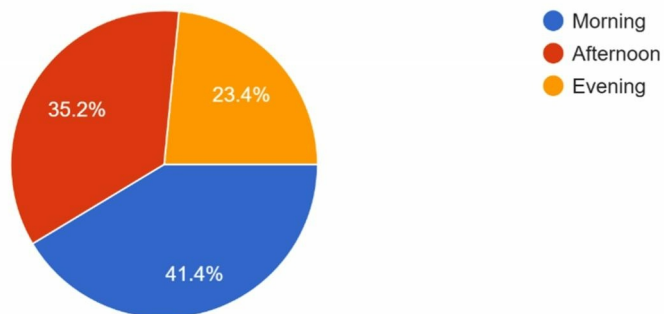
How often do you visit the playground?

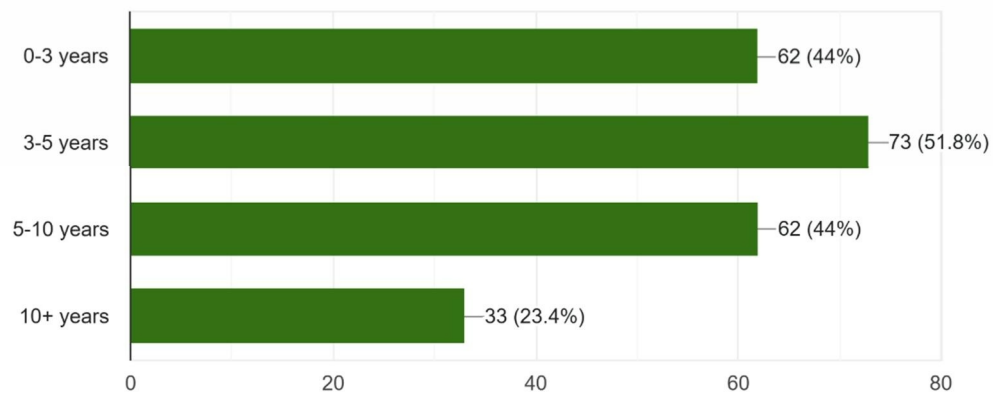
What is the primary reason you visit the playground?

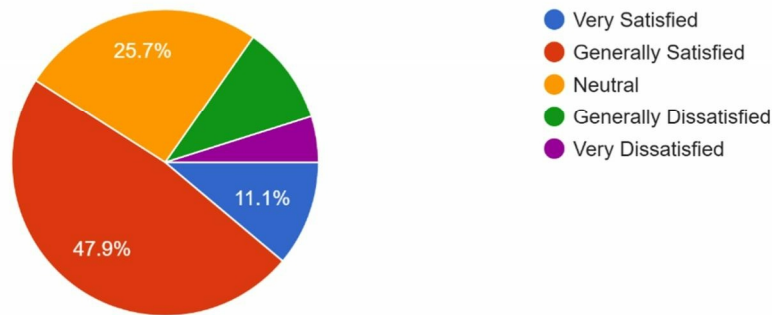
What age group(s) are your children? (select all that apply)

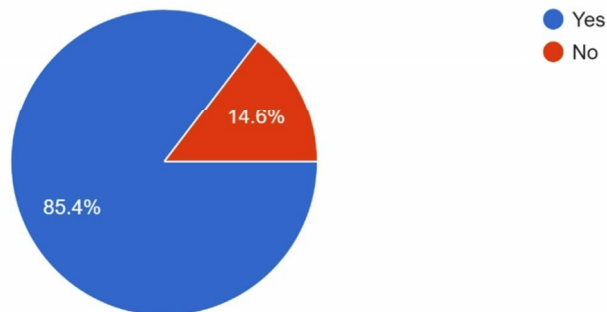

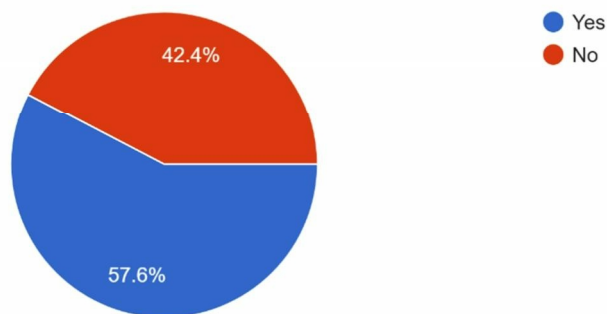

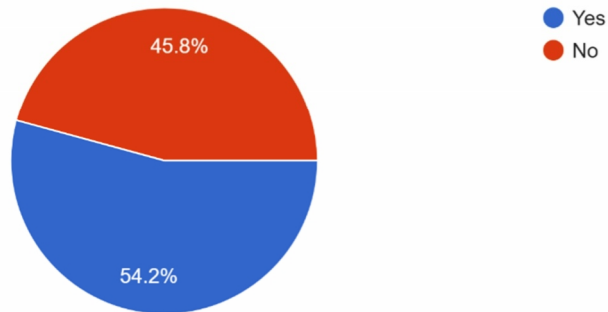
Does the existing playground provide enough shade for children?

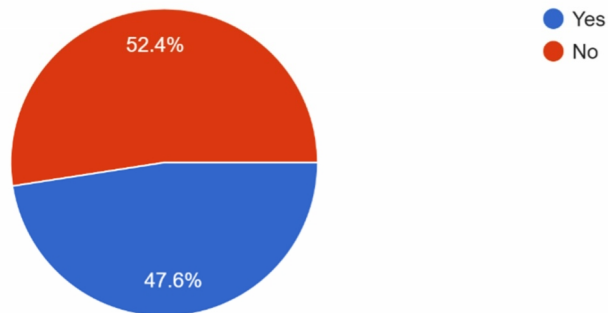
Does the existing playground provide enough shade for parents/caregivers?

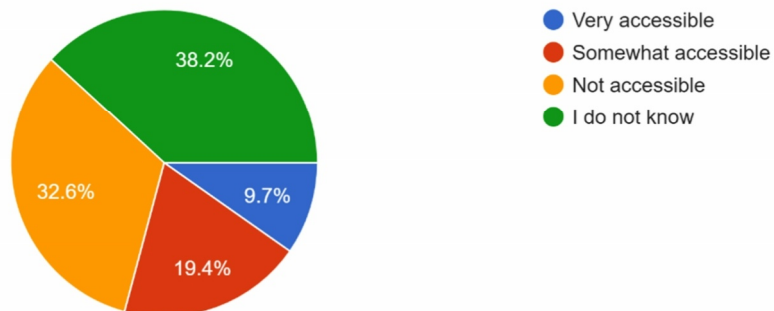
Does the existing playground provide enough seating?

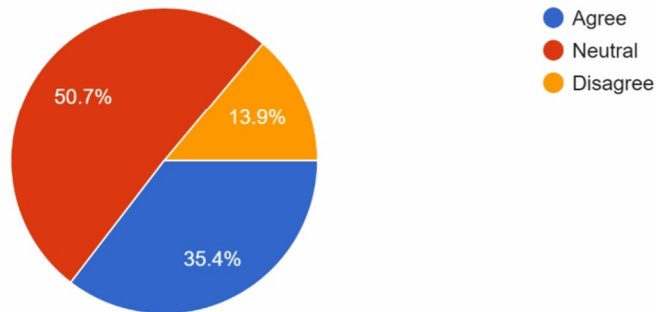
How accessible is the playground for children with disabilities?

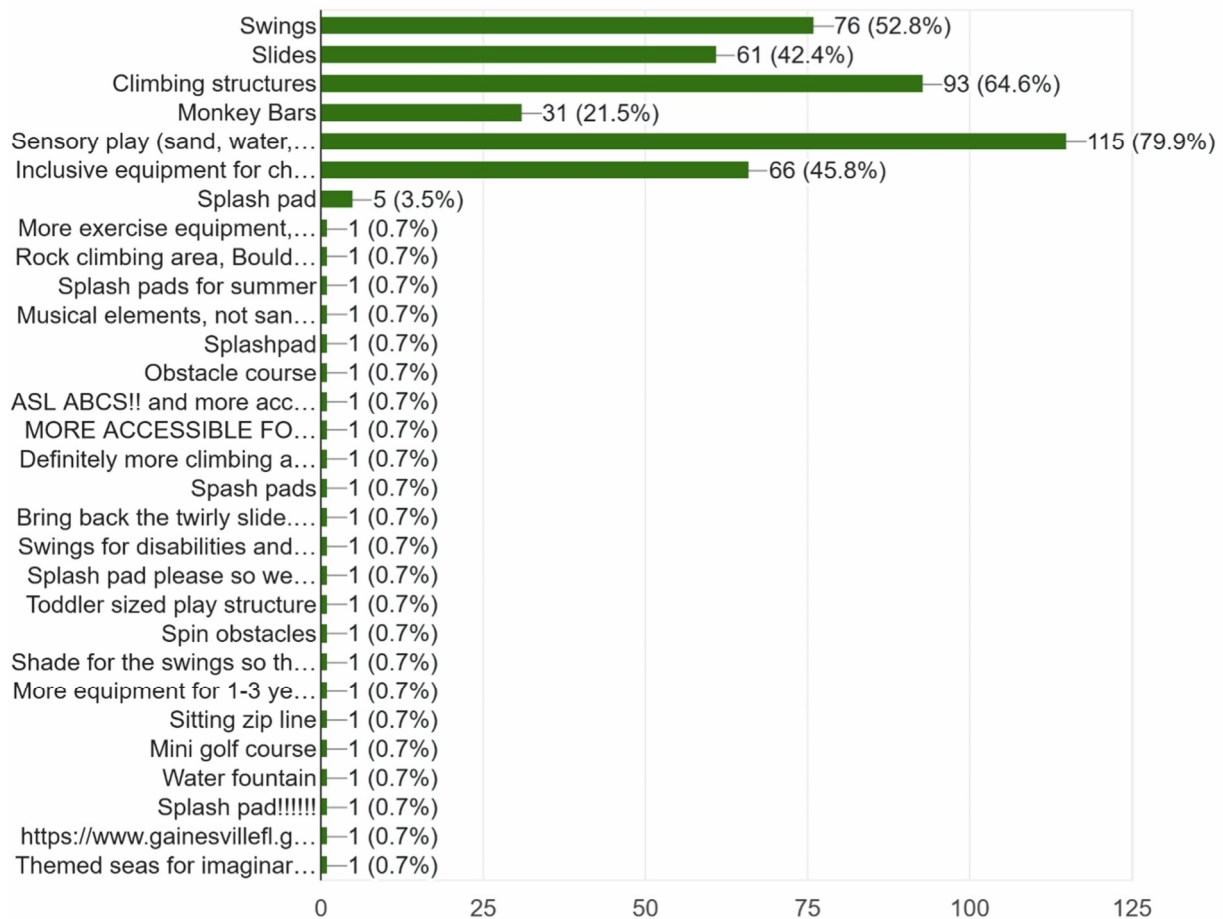
Do you feel the lighting at the playground is adequate?

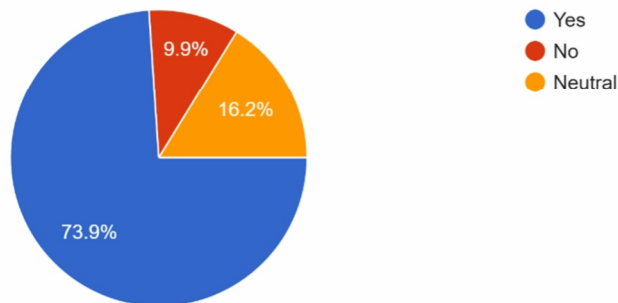
What types of equipment would you like to see more of? (select all that apply)

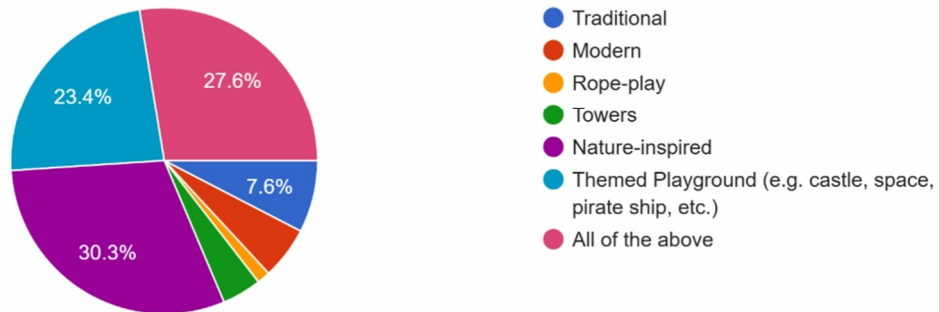

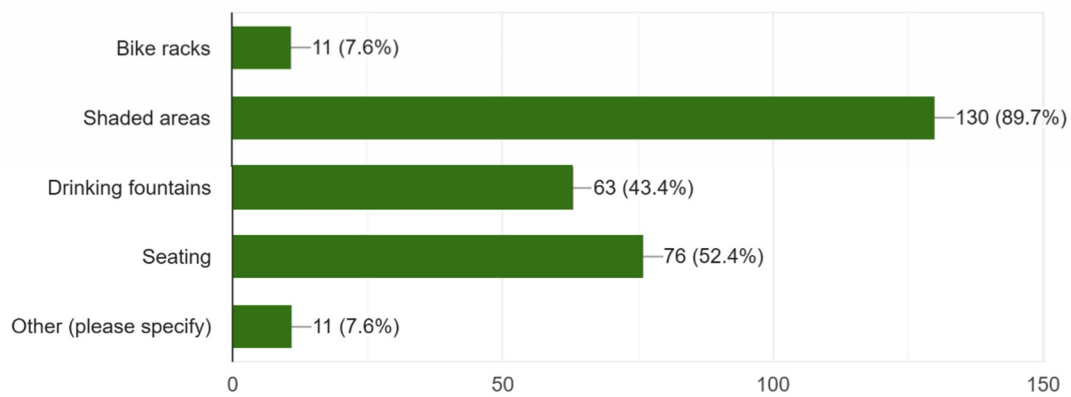
What design style do you prefer for the new playground?

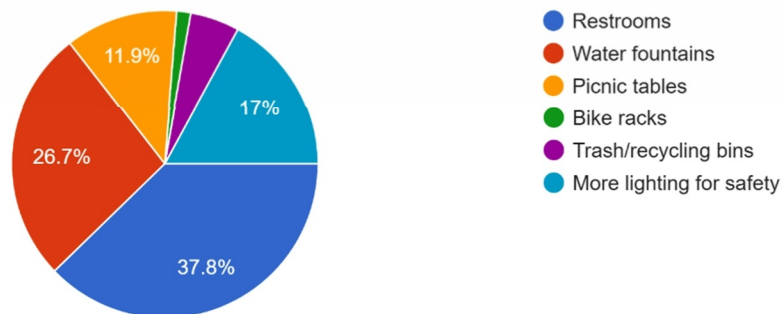
What playground accessory features are a priority for you? (Select top 2)

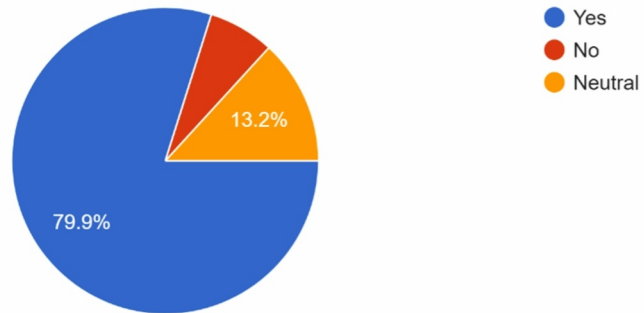
What amenities would you like to see added or improved?
