ITEM 14d: ORDINANCE AMENDING THE PALM DESERT MUNICIPAL CODE TO UPDATE, CLARIFY, AND CODIFY BYLAWS AND GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR THE CITY'S BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, COMMITTEES, AND TASK FORCES

NOTE: In response to a public records request seeking all records related to communications between staff and the City Council Subcommittee regarding the subject ordinance, staff believes it is prudent to provide the same records to the full City Council.

Q1: Given the significant nature of these proposed changes, would it be appropriate to hold a study session to discuss them in greater detail?

A1: Staff consulted with the City Council Subcommittee on Boards and Commissions regarding whether the proposed changes should be presented in a Study Session. The Subcommittee determined that a Study Session was not necessary and directed staff to bring the proposed ordinance directly to the full City Council for consideration.

Mayor Harnik and Councilmember Pradetto:

We are meeting tomorrow afternoon to discuss the City's Boards and Commissions. To help us prepare, Mayor Harnik requested that I gather feedback from the staff liaisons, which I have attached for your review.

Additionally, I'd like to highlight a proposal previously supported by the subcommittee. The proposal recommends revamping the Marketing Committee from an advisory body to the City Council to an advisory body to the Public Affairs Manager. This change would reclassify the Marketing Committee as a non-Brown Act body, allowing greater flexibility for working professionals to meet virtually. However, meetings must still be posted at least three days in advance and remain open to the public. Details of the proposal are outlined in the attachment.

Recommendations for Membership Overall:

To enhance consistency and clarity in the structure of the City's Boards and Commissions, it is recommended that the City Council adopt the following modifications to membership composition:

Standardize Membership to Seven Members:
 Establish a consistent membership size of seven (7) members for all City Boards,
 Commissions, and Committees, with the exception of the Planning Commission, which will remain at five (5) members.

2. Specific Adjustments:

- Civic Engagement Committee: Reduce membership from up to twelve (12) members to seven (7).
- Library Advisory Committee: Increase membership from five (5) members plus two
 (2) alternates to seven (7) full members.
- Parks and Recreation Committee: Reduce membership from nine (9) members to seven (7).

3. Limit Alternate Membership to One:

For any board or commission where alternate members are deemed necessary, limit the number to one (1) alternate member. This will reduce confusion regarding appointments and ensure clarity in addressing vacancies or absences.

FEEDBACK FROM STAFF LIAISONS

Architectural Review Commission

Membership: 7 members/appointees

1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?

No comment. (CF)

2. Is the current meeting frequency appropriate for their workload? Should they meet more or less frequently? Why?

No change. (CF)

Civic Engagement Committee

Membership: Currently 9 appointees; up to 12 members

- 1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?
 - The Civic Engagement Committee has made valuable contributions, such as the Civic Academy, but its effectiveness is limited by a lack of alignment with the City Council's direction. Members are **not authorized to act as City ambassadors**, leaving staff to implement recommendations despite **limited staff capacity** due to expanded programs like the Civic Academy and Youth Civic Engagement efforts. Many discussions focus on routine topics, raising concerns about whether the time and resources spent on meetings are the best use of staff and committee members' efforts. (RP)
- 2. Is the current meeting frequency appropriate for their workload? Should they meet more or less frequently? Why?

The Civic Engagement Committee's quarterly meeting schedule could be **reduced to an** "as-needed" basis, ensuring meetings are convened only when there are substantive topics or initiatives requiring the committee's input. (RP)

Cultural Arts Committee

Membership: 7 members/appointees, plus 1 alternate

1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?

Cultural Arts Committee (CAC) concerns include members' misunderstanding of formal meeting processes and a **lack of clarity regarding their roles** despite ongoing training. Additionally, one member has served on the committee for 11 years, which has hindered the introduction of fresh perspectives. (EP/AL)

The committee held a pseudo-governing role in the public art program for many years. Although intended as an advisory body, past practices created an entitlement to control all aspects of the program, limiting staff autonomy. This has led to confusion about the committee's role. To clarify responsibilities, staff seeks direction from the Council subcommittee, which can then be relayed to the full committee. The following are specific examples to consider:

• Community Input for Projects:

Can staff independently decide to solicit community input for projects, or is committee approval required? The committee may not see the value in gathering community input for certain projects, such as the El Paseo entry signs or other large-scale initiatives in the city.

Seeking City Council Input on Rejected Projects:

When staff proposes projects to the committee that are later rejected, should staff have the option to seek City Council input? For example, staff proposed purchasing a sculpture for a park in south Palm Desert that would include a community programming element. The committee rejected the project, citing an overabundance of artwork in the south end and a preference to focus on the north end. However, there is available funding for this project, and the site is specifically suited to the proposed location. Another example would be the negotiation for the placement of Coachella artwork as an economic driver for the city. (EP/AL)

2. Is the current meeting frequency appropriate for their workload? Should they meet more or less frequently? Why?

Cultural Resources Preservation Committee

Membership: 7 members/appointees

1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?

Membership: 7 members/6 appointees

1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?

No comment. (TS)

2. Is the current meeting frequency appropriate for their workload? Should they meet more or less frequently? Why?

Finance Committee

Membership: 7 members/appointees; 5 public + 2 councilmembers

1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?

The frequency might be more meaningful on a **quarterly basis**. Currently, they meet bimonthly, with adjustments needing to be made in summer and winter. Last year we ended up only having/needing 3 meetings. City reports are still presented each month and delivered to the City Council. (VC)

2. Is the current meeting frequency appropriate for their workload? Should they meet more or less frequently? Why?

The Finance Committee will be responsible for reviewing the Measure G District Tax revenues and their use. Sales Tax monies are typically provided based on the quarterly payments from the State (there are some exceptions), so the timing of a **quarterly meeting** would also fit well to that end. (VC)

Homelessness Task Force

Membership: 7 members/appointees

- 1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?
 - No comment. (CE)
- 2. Is the current meeting frequency appropriate for their workload? Should they meet more or less frequently? Why?

The Homeless Task Force (HTF) approved its work plan in November 2024, which supported existing priorities and services. Outside of HTF informational requests, staff spends significant time generating meaningful agenda items to justify holding a meeting. Should there be Council requests for the HTF or urgent items, staff can request a special meeting of the HTF. The HTF could meet twice a year or ad hoc. (CE)

Library Advisory Committee

Membership: 5 members/appointees, plus 2 alternates

- 1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?
 - No comment. (GS)
- 2. Is the current meeting frequency appropriate for their workload? Should they meet more or less frequently? Why?

The Committee meets monthly, which has been beneficial during the first year of operations. By the end of the fiscal year, operations, services, and metrics are expected to be normalized, supporting a transition to quarterly meetings. Shifting to quarterly meetings after June 30, 2025, would eliminate redundancy in meeting content. (CE)

Marketing Committee

Membership: 7 members/4 appointees

1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?

The Marketing Committee, composed of marketing professionals who live and/or work in Palm Desert, is a valuable resource for the City's tourism marketing efforts. However, its effectiveness has been impacted by the demanding schedules of its members and the attendance requirements imposed by its designation as a formal Brown Act committee. Since the committee has no policy-making authority or budget oversight but primarily provides advice to the Public Affairs Manager and recommendations to the City Council, reframing it as an advisory committee to the Public Affairs Manager may be more effective. (TS)

2. Is the current meeting frequency appropriate for their workload? Should they meet more or less frequently? Why?

The current bi-monthly meeting schedule has generally been effective. However, the City's marketing program's seasonality suggests that a **more flexible approach may be beneficial**. In some parts of the year, meeting monthly would better align with marketing needs, while at other times, no meetings may be necessary. (TS)

Recommendations for the Marketing Committee:

To address recurring challenges in achieving a quorum due to the professional commitments of members, while retaining the valuable expertise and input of working professionals, it is recommended that the City Council consider the following actions regarding the Marketing Committee:

1. Dissolution and Reconstitution:

- Dissolve the existing Marketing Committee as a Council-appointed Brown Act body.
- Reconstitute the Marketing Committee as an advisory body to the Public Affairs Manager.

2. New Structure and Operations:

- o Establish the committee's membership at up to seven (7) members.
- o Require a minimum of six (6) meetings per year, scheduled as needed.
- Allow virtual meetings to accommodate professional schedules and maximize participation.

3. Transparency and Accountability Measures:

- Adopt a resolution outlining the committee's purpose, structure, and operating guidelines.
- Require the posting of meeting agendas in compliance with Brown Act standards.
- o Keep meetings open to the public and ensure minutes are recorded.
- Prohibit serial meetings to maintain integrity in decision-making and adherence to legal requirements.
- Specify that the Public Affairs Manager is responsible for communicating the committee's advice and recommendations accurately and without filtering or disregarding input.

Parks and Recreation Committee:

Membership: 9 members/appointees

1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?

The Committee Members are **overly involved in operational/managerial matters**. It would be beneficial to have a stronger work plan and clearer delineation of their role as advisors to the City Council. (KS/CE)

The bylaws currently require nine members, but this number seems excessive. **Reducing the committee to seven members** could streamline decision-making and increase efficiency. (KS)

The committee currently includes members who have served for over 15 years. Introducing **term limits** could help bring in fresh perspectives and new ideas, ensuring continued innovation and diversity of thought. (KS)

2. Is the current meeting frequency appropriate for their workload? Should they meet more or less frequently? Why?

Planning Commission

Membership: 5 members/appointees

1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?

Public Safety Committee

Membership: 7 members/appointees

1. Are there any areas of concern that you would like to bring to their attention?

This committee could meet every other month or quarterly. In 2024, the Public Safety Committee created subcommittees to collaborate with staff between regular meetings on PSC work plan priorities. This approach has resulted in more efficient meetings.

Police staffing levels were a top concern for the PSC. However, with the City Council's approval of the new staffing, this item will require less time and study by the PSC. Special meetings can be called if public safety business arises.

Mayor Harnik and Councilmember Pradetto,

I have two follow-up items related to the Finance Committee and the Resource Preservation and Enhancement Committee. To keep this email concise, I have attached a document with details for your review. Please note that after our first meeting, your recommendation was to transition RPEC to meet semi-annually.

1) Resource Preservation and Enhancement Committee (RPEC)

The staff liaison has raised concerns that, in the absence of agenda items, some committee members have introduced presentations that appear to align with personal interests rather than the committee's intended purpose. Recent examples include:

- A request for a presentation from SunLine that focused less on sustainability and more on advocating for an east/west transit connection in north Palm Desert.
- A recommendation for staff to invite Southern California Edison (SCE) to present a disaster recovery plan for the Coachella Valley, citing concerns over population growth and the capacity to provide power to new developments.

While these topics may be of general interest, they do not appear to align with the committee's stated purpose and responsibilities. Additionally, the **Environmental Sustainability Plan** and **Greenhouse Gas Inventory** referenced in the committee's bylaws are outdated and no longer actively used by staff. Given this, the committee's purpose and responsibilities may require clarification to better align with current City Council priorities.

To ensure a more effective and purpose-driven structure, staff recommends transitioning RPEC to an **as-needed meeting schedule**, convening only when:

- The City Council refers specific items for review and consideration.
- A **project arises** that would benefit from committee feedback, as determined by staff or the City Council.

Below are the current statements for reference:

- Purpose: "The purpose of the Resource Preservation and Enhancement Committee is to oversee the implementation of the Environmental Sustainability Plan ('Plan') and Greenhouse Gas Inventory as approved by the City Council and recommend to the City Council any changes to this Plan."
- Responsibilities: "It shall be the responsibility of the Resource Preservation and Enhancement Committee to make recommendations to the City Council with respect to matters concerning the City's programs and targets in achieving identified actions in the Environmental Sustainability Plan ('Plan') and Greenhouse Gas Inventory. The committee shall have the authority and responsibility to review staff reports and recommendations from City staff, offer comments and feedback, and help develop appropriate policies and actions to meet the Plan's goals."

2) Finance Committee

The current purpose statement allows the committee to recommend amendments to the City's fiscal and investment policies. However, this has led to conflicts, as some members have advocated for a focus on Socially Responsible Investments. Staff would appreciate clarification on the City Council's intent:

- Should the committee have the discretion to recommend policy revisions independently?
- Or should amendments only be considered at the direction of the City Council, when explicitly referred to the committee?

If the latter, staff will propose an amendment to the purpose and responsibilities statements to clarify this distinction. Below are the current statements for reference:

- **Purpose:** "The Finance Committee shall advise the City Council and work to promote and enhance fiscal responsibility, accountability, integrity, and transparency, and to recommend fiscal and investment policies for City Council consideration."
- Responsibilities: "The Finance Committee reviews and, if necessary, advises the City Council on auditing and internal controls; financial reporting; investments; municipal debt and refunding; and other functions as requested by the City Council."

Introduce an Ordinance entitled," AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM DESERT, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE PALM DESERT MUNICIPAL CODE TO UPDATE, CLARIFY, AND CODIFY BYLAWS AND GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, COMMITTEES, AND TASK FORCES."

BACKGROUND/ANALYSIS:

The City Council Subcommittee on Boards and Commissions, composed of Councilmember Pradetto and Mayor Harnik, met with staff on January 17, 2025, to discuss proposed updates to the municipal code governing the City's appointed bodies. The subcommittee expressed support for the recommended changes, which aim to ensure alignment with priorities, improve efficiency, and address concerns raised by staff liaisons.

The ordinance updates several key areas, including:

- Finance Committee The updated language clarifies that the Finance Committee may review and provide recommendations on fiscal and investment policies only when specifically referred by the City Council. This change resolves previous conflicts where members introduced investment policy discussions that were not within the intended scope.
- Resource Preservation & Enhancement Committee (RPEC) The Environmental Sustainability Plan and Greenhouse Gas Inventory referenced in the committee's bylaws are outdated and no longer used by staff. Additionally, the committee had been meeting without clear agenda items, leading to discussions outside its intended scope. To improve focus, RPEC will now meet on an as-needed basis, convening only when the City Council refers specific items or when staff determines committee input is beneficial.
- Eligibility Requirements To prevent potential conflicts of interest, the ordinance prohibits relatives of City employees and officials from serving on any appointed body and establishes a 12-month waiting period after an employee leaves City service before their relatives may be eligible to serve.

- Standardized Membership The ordinance establishes a seven-member standard for most appointed bodies to improve consistency and efficiency. This affects the Civic Engagement Committee (reduced from 12), Library Advisory Committee (increased from five plus two alternates), and Parks and Recreation Committee (reduced from nine). The Planning Commission remains at five members. No current members will be removed; reductions will occur gradually through attrition, which may result in some incumbent members not being reappointed when their terms expire.
- **Meeting Schedules** Several committees have adjusted their meeting schedules based on workload and necessity. Below are the changes:

These changes ensure that meetings occur only when necessary, improving efficiency while maintaining transparency and community engagement.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There is minimal fiscal impact associated with the publication of the ordinance. Adjustments to meeting schedules may result in minor cost savings related to staff time and administrative expenses.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PALM DESERT, CALIFORNIA, AMENDING THE PALM DESERT MUNICIPAL CODE TO UPDATE, CLARIFY, AND CODIFY BYLAWS AND GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, COMMITTEES, AND TASK FORCES

The City Council of the City of Palm Desert, California, does hereby ordain as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Amendment to Municipal Code. Palm Desert Municipal Code Chapter 2.16 *Finance Committee* of Title 2 *Administration and Personnel*, is hereby amended as follows:

"CHAPTER 2.16 FINANCE COMMITTEE

2.16.020 Purpose.

The Finance Committee shall advise the city council and work to promote and enhance fiscal responsibility, accountability, integrity, and transparency.

2.16.050 Responsibilities.

The Finance Committee shall review and, if necessary, advise the city council on auditing and internal controls, financial reporting, investments, municipal debt and refunding, and other financial matters as referred by the city council. The committee may review and provide recommendations on fiscal and investment policies only when specifically referred by the city council."

<u>Section 2.</u> Amendment to Municipal Code. Palm Desert Municipal Code Chapter 2.34 *Boards, Commissions, Committees, and Task Forces – General Provisions* of Title 2 *Administration and Personnel*, is hereby amended as follows:

"Chapter 2.34 BOARDS, COMMISSIONS, COMMITTEES, AND TASK FORCES – GENERAL PROVISIONS

2.34.030 Eligibility.

- B. **City Employees.** City employees are not eligible to serve as members of an appointed body.
- C. Relatives of City Employees and Officials. A relative of a city employee or city council member shall not be eligible to serve on any appointed body and shall remain ineligible for 12 months following the employee's separation from city employment.

1. "Relative" includes mother, father, sister, brother, spouse, domestic partner, daughter, son, mother-in-law, father-in-law, sister-in-law, brother-in-law, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, grandmother, grandfather, granddaughter, grandson, aunt, uncle, first cousin, nieces, and nephews.

<u>Section 3.</u> Amendment to Municipal Code. Chapter 2.58 *Parks and Recreation Committee* of Title 2 *Administration and Personnel* of the Palm Desert Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

"Chapter 2.58 PARKS AND RECREATION COMMITTEE

2.58.020 Members.

The parks and recreation committee shall be composed of seven regular members from the community. Additionally, a representative from Desert Recreation District, Family YMCA of the Desert, and any other organization that has an interest in parks and recreation are encouraged to attend."

<u>Section 4.</u> Amendment to Municipal Code. Chapter 2.60 *Public Safety Committee* of Title 2 *Administration and Personnel* of the Palm Desert Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

"Chapter 2.60 PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE

2.60.040 Meetings.

The Public Safety Committee may hold meetings every other month at a date, time, and place as set by committee resolution or minute order."

<u>Section 5.</u> Amendment to Municipal Code. Chapter 2.62 *Civic Engagement Committee* of Title 2 *Administration and Personnel* of the Palm Desert Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

"Chapter 2.62 CIVIC ENGAGEMENT COMMITTEE

2.62.030 Members.

The Civic Engagement Committee shall be composed of seven members and should reflect a cross-section of the community.

2.62.040 Meetings.

The Civic Engagement Committee may hold meetings semi-annually at a date, time, and place as set by committee resolution or minute order."

<u>Section 6.</u> Amendment to Municipal Code. Chapter 2.66 Resource Preservation & Enhancement Committee of Title 2 Administration and Personnel of the Palm Desert Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

"Chapter 2.66 RESOURCE PRESERVATION & ENHANCEMENT COMMITTEE

2.66.020 Purpose.

The purpose of the Resource Preservation & Enhancement Committee is to provide recommendations to the city council on policies and initiatives related to sustainability, resource conservation, and environmental stewardship.

2.66.040 Meetings.

The Resource Preservation & Enhancement Committee shall meet on an asneeded basis at the direction of the City Council or when City staff determines that committee input would be beneficial for a specific project or policy matter.

2.66.050 Responsibilities.

The Resource Preservation & Enhancement Committee shall advise the city council on sustainability and resource conservation efforts as they relate to city policies, programs, and projects. Its responsibilities include providing input on sustainability and environmental policies, programs, and initiatives referred by the city council, as well as reviewing and offering recommendations on specific projects or policy proposals identified by city staff or the city council. The committee shall serve as a resource for evaluating best practices in environmental sustainability when requested and collaborate with stakeholders to support community engagement efforts related to environmental preservation when directed by the city council. The committee shall meet only when specific items are referred for review and consideration by the city council or when city staff identifies a project that would benefit from committee feedback."

<u>Section 7.</u> Amendment to Municipal Code. Chapter 2.70 *Homelessness Task Force* of Title 2 *Administration and Personnel* of the Palm Desert Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

"Chapter 2.70 HOMELESSNESS TASK FORCE

2.70.040 Meetings.

The Homelessness Task Force may hold meetings semi-annually at a date, time, and place as set by task force resolution or minute order."

<u>Section 8.</u> Amendment to Municipal Code. Palm Desert Municipal Code Title 29 *Cultural Resources*, Chapter 29.30 *Cultural Resources Preservation Committee*, is hereby amended as follows:

"Chapter 29.30 CULTURAL RESOURCES PRESERVATION COMMITTEE 29.30.030 Meetings.

The Cultural Resources Preservation Committee may hold meetings every other month at a date, time, and place as set by committee resolution or minute order."

<u>Section 9.</u> Amendment to Municipal Code. Section 2.74.070 *Library advisory committee* of Title 2 *Administration and Personnel* of the Palm Desert Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

"Chapter 2.74 PUBLIC LIBRARY

- **2.74.070(C) Members.** The committee shall be composed of seven community members.
- **2.74.070(D) Meetings.** The committee may hold meetings quarterly at a date, time, and place as set by committee resolution or minute order.
- <u>Section 10.</u> Severability. If any section, subsection, clause or phrase of this Ordinance or any part thereof is for any reason held to be invalid, unconstitutional, or unenforceable by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of the Ordinance. The City Council declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase would be declared invalid, unconstitutional or unenforceable.
- Section 11. CEQA. The City Council hereby finds and determines that this Ordinance is exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines section 15061(b)(3) because it can be seen with certainty that the Ordinance would not have the potential or possibility for causing a significant effect on the environment. Specifically, the proposed changes to the Municipal Code are primarily procedural and administrative in nature. Moreover, the changes are technical in nature and do not allow for specific development. In reviewing the Ordinance the City Council has exercised its independent judgment and has reviewed and considered the Ordinance in light of all testimony received, both oral and written. Therefore, based upon the entire administrative record, the City Council hereby determines that no further environmental review is required for the Ordinance.
- **SECTION 12. Publication.** The City Clerk of the City of Palm Desert, California, is hereby directed to publish a summary of this Ordinance in the Desert Sun, a newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Palm Desert, California, and shall be in full force and effective thirty (30) days after its adoption.
